EVACUATIONS ORDERED FOR FOOTHILL COMMUNITIES

The Foothills Incident Unified Command has ordered mandatory evacuations tomorrow, Tuesday, February 9, due to the risk of debris flows in the Station Fire burn area.

Evacuations have been ordered for areas of La Crescenta, La Canada Flintridge, and Acton. Affected residents are being notified through Alert LA County and by door-to-door notification by LA County Sheriff's deputies. A full address list of affected homes is available on the Coordinated Agency Recovery Effort (CARE) website at www.dpwcare.org.

Evacuations must be completed by 10 a.m. Affected residents and residents of flood-prone areas are urged not to leave vehicles or trash bins in the street.

The evacuations have been ordered as a safety precaution following predictions of rainfall Tuesday and Wednesday. Residents are strongly urged to comply with the evacuation orders.

American Red Cross has established evacuation shelters for La Canada and La Crescenta at Holy Redeemer Catholic Church, 2411 Montrose Avenue, Montrose, CA 91020 and in Acton at Acton Community Center, 3748 Nichols St., Acton, CA 93510.

EVACUATIONS ORDERED FOR FOOTHILL COMMUNITIES

The Foothills Incident Unified Command has ordered mandatory evacuations today, Saturday, February 6, at 12 noon due to the risk of additional debris flows in the Station Fire burn area.

Evacuations have been ordered for areas of La Crescenta, La Canada Flintridge, and Acton. Affected residents are being notified through Alert LA County and by door-to-door notification by LA County Sheriff's Deputies. A full address list of affected homes is available on the Coordinated Agency Recovery Effort (CARE) website at www.dpwcare.org.

The evacuations have been ordered as a safety precaution following predictions of up to heavy rain fall later today. Residents are strongly urged to comply with the evacuation orders.

American Red Cross has established evacuation shelters at La Canada High School in the south gym, 4463 Oak Grove Drive, La Canada.

EVACUATIONS LIFTED

Effective immediately, based upon continued evaluation of the weather, the flood control systems, and roadway access, the Incident Commanders have lifted all mandatory evacuations for the foothill communities of La Canada Flintridge, La Crescenta, and Acton.

Residents with valid identification only will be allowed access to these evacuated areas.

All temporary "No Parking" restrictions have also been lifted. However, officials recommend that residents continue to park in their driveways to allow heavy equipment to work in the area.

Residents of La Canada Flintridge and La Crescenta are reminded that truck activity will be constant throughout the communities as County Public Works Department crews continue to clean debris basins.

Residents of the Paradise Valley community and Ocean View Boulevard are also advised to be cautious of heavy equipment that will be working on neighborhood streets.

Unified Command will continue to evaluate weather conditions. Resident should monitor www.dpwcare.org for further updates.
