STATION FIRE UPDATE

(Fire 56% Contained...Shelter and Road Closures)

LOS ANGELES (Mon., Sept. 7, 2009 – 12 noon) – The Station Fire, which started off of Angeles Crest Highway (SR-2) about one mile above Angeles Crest Fire Station around 3:30 p.m. on Aug. 26, has burned 157,220 acres and is 56 percent contained.

The fire is now the 10th largest fire in the State of California since 1932, and has burned more than 240 square miles of land within the Angeles National Forest and near surrounding foothill communities of La Canada-Flintridge, Altadena, La Crescenta, Acton, Aliso Canyon, Soledad Canyon, Pasadena, Mt. Wilson, Mt. Lukens, Sunland-Tujunga, Glendale and Sierra Madre.

Overnight fire crews continued to prepare control lines for a planned burn-out operation near Mt. Wilson (east and northeast), home to a communications facility that houses local radio and television station towers, and an observatory, was scheduled to take place today, but has been postponed due to weather condition. Burn-out operations will be conducted on and off today in Chilao. The fire crews continue to improve and construct lines in and around Chilao, Three Points and Sulphur Springs. Cool temperatures and light winds significantly slowed the fire's momentum overnight. With the Station Fire 56 percent contained some of the operations are in a mop-up or patrol status. This will allow Incident Commander and his fire managers to reallocate resources to the east and southeast flanks of the fire in order to construct and reinforce fire lines. Direct fire lines will continue northward into the San Gabriel Wilderness. The burning activity is well within the planned control lines. The fire line from Newcomb Peak to Chantry Flats will be improved during the day operations. A structure protection group will be in place in the Crystal Springs area. Air tankers and helicopters are committed for needed support on the day operations. Fire line is planned for completion from the east side of the San Gabriel River to Rincon Rd. Patrols and mop-up will continue along Angeles Crest Hwy. SR-2.

Approximately 5,000 residences are threatened at this time, including 200 commercial structures and 2,000 out buildings and others. 78 residences and recreational cabins have been confirmed as destroyed. 86 outbuildings and other have been destroyed as well.

More than 4,623 personnel are working the fire.

10 injuries have been reported. On Sept. 1, a firefighter working on the Station Fire in the Aliso Canyon area of Acton was overcome by noxious fumes.

The firefighter suffered respiratory arrest and was taken to a local medical facility for further treatment and evaluation. On Sept. 3, six firefighters were transported to a local hospital after being overwhelmed by unknown fumes in a different part of Aliso Canyon. The firefighters were treated and released.

Two Los Angeles County firefighters were killed on Aug. 30, as they were fighting the Station Fire. A memorial service for the two firefighters will take place at Dodger Stadium located at 1000 Elysian Park Way in Los Angeles on Sat., Sept. 12 (10 a.m.). Free parking will be provided. On Sept. 3, after forensic examination of the point of origin of the Station Fire the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, Los Angeles County Fire Department and U.S. Forest Service announced that the Station Fire was caused by arson and a homicide investigation is underway. The investigation will be led by homicide investigators with assistance from the Sheriff's Arson/Explosive Detail, Los Angeles County Fire Department and U.S. Forest Service. There is no new information to report at this time. Any questions regarding this investigation should be directed to Homicide Lt. Liam Gallagher at (323) 890-5500.

The Governor proclaimed a state of emergency for Los Angeles County on Aug. 28. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors proclaimed a local emergency on Sept. 1, due to the various wildfires.
